

# **MEDICAL FACULTIES** one university, five faculties, endless possibilities



Numbers ≠ prestige. Medicine was one of the four pillars of sciences taught at Charles University since its foundation in 1348. In 1945, the Faculty of Medicine expanded into the East and West Bohemia, establishing its two local branches in Pilsen and Hradec Králové respectively. Soon after, in 1953, the Prague faculty was split in three, each focusing on a different field: stomatology, paediatry, and hygiene. Nowadays, our five medical faculties all offer studies in General Medicine with Dentistry being available in all of the three university cities. Each faculty provides unique student experience, accommodating diverse needs and preferences of any applicant.

#### FIRST FACULTY

#### TUITION FEE: €24,250 INT. STUDENTS: 800-900 ADM/GRAD RATE: 29/56%

Located right in the beating heart of Prague, it is the oldest medical faculty in Central Europe. Besides studying the classicalydesigned curriculum of General Medicine, Dentistry is also available. With its seven clinical facilities and the largest student community, it is also the biggest medical school in Czechia.

#### SECOND FACULTY

#### TUITION FEE: €16,840 INT. STUDENTS: 200-300 ADM/GRAD RATE: 24/47%

The favourable teacher-student ratio allows much more **personal approach**. This creates tighter, almost **family-style community**, and influences the teaching methods featuring smaller study circles. To this day, the faculty still maintains its focus on **paediatry**. Students have access to the **biggest clinical facility** in the country and one of the biggest in all Europe, the University Hospital in Motol.

#### THIRD FACULTY

#### TUITION FEE: €16,840 INT. STUDENTS: 500-600 ADM/GRAD RATE: 36,5/51%

Based on the US system, this faculty is the only medical school in Central and Eastern Europe to offer the revised integrated curriculum. Its modules allow students to gain more comprehensive understanding of each subject matter. The acquisition of practical skills is emphasized as students meet patients already in the first year.

# FACULTY IN HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ

TUITION FEE: €16,220 / 16,630 INT. STUDENTS: 300-400 ADM/GRAD RATE: 37/51%

The Hradec faculty offers **family atmosphere** and **vibrant student life** for students of **Medicine and Dentistry** alike. Together with several other university institutions, it lends this beautiful **college town** a youthful and international touch. Its pictoresque architecture, extensive greenery, and nearby mountains make it a dream-like destination for any active student. **Everything is within walking distance**. New campus including the **Faculty of Pharmacy** is currently under construction.







# FACULTY IN PILSEN

TUITION FEE: €15,820 INT. STUDENTS: 500 ADM/GRAD RATE: 47,5/58,5%

The Pilsen faculty is located in a **brand new campus** with all the clinical facilities nearby. The modern campus also includes a **state-of-the-art Biomedical Centre** with great research opportunities and our **most advanced Simulation Centre**. Studying **Dentistry** here is ever-increasingly popular. The **afforable living costs** and **super easy west-ward traveling** through Germany make Pilsen quite the irresistable study destination.





# SOCIAL SCIENCES, LIBERAL ARTS & HUMANITIES

Psychology, foreign languages and literatures, law, social work, education, or fine and performing arts... These are just some of **the most requested fields by our applicants**. So far, most of them are **available in Czech language only**, therefore requiring the applicant to be familiar with the Czech language first. Fortunately, our **in-house language and preparatory courses** are available to overcome this barrier. Importantly then, a range of **English-taught 'soft' academic fields** is available at Charles University mainly at the two following faculties.

#### FACULTY OF HUMANITIES

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The term "liberal arts" derives from the Medieval Latin **artes** *liberales* – *artes* meaning "subjects of study," and *liberales* meaning "proper to free persons." At the medieval European universities, "liberal arts" referred to the seven branches of learning considered suitable for freemen: grammar, logic, and rhetoric (i.e. *trivium*), leading to a Bachelor of Arts; and arithmetic, geometry, astronomy, and music (i.e. *quadrivium*), leading to the Master of Arts.

Nowadays, our undergraduate programme Liberal Arts and Humanities include the study of anthropology, sociology, psychology, philosophy, history, gender, and arts. The multidisciplinary 3-year long curriculum provides strong foundation for students with diverse needs and prospects. After receiving comprehensive insight into various fields, discourses, and methodologies during the first year, students start to specialise in their own individual academic pathways. With the possibility to get extra 20 credits per year, graduates can pursue their further studies even at US universities, albeit they usually choose to continue in Prague.

### FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES

With the backdrop of the falling Berlin Wall on November 8, 1989, the faculty was founded still under the Czechoslovakian banner right in 1990. On January 1, 1993, Czechoslovakia was peacefully divided in two independent states: Czechia and Slovakia, hereby creating the independent state of the Czech Republic. These days, 20 years has passed since Czechia joined European Union and became the **strategic site of the entire region**.

The faculty offers **four distinct undergraduate programmes** which are a genuine reflection of the history within the innovative and ever-evolving Central European context, making them incredibly relevant: **Economics and Finance**; **History and Area Studies**; **Politics**, **Philosophy and Economics**; **and Social Sciences**. Intertwined with ongoing real world issues, the faculty serves as a strong platform for students of today who are eager to engage in **critical and applicable research**. Each programme presents the students with a unique opportunity to explore **interdisciplinary perspectives of multiple social sciences** at once.
